



EDUCATIONAL VISIT

Living and Learning Design Centre (LLDC), Bhuj

The students of **Class X** of Welspun Vidya Mandir embarked on a one-day educational visit to the **Living and Learning Design Centre (LLDC)** in **Bhuj** to explore India's rich and diverse craft heritage. The visit aimed to provide students with an immersive opportunity to experience traditional Indian art forms beyond the classroom and gain practical knowledge through engaging, hands-on activities.



Students of Classes X-B and X-C visited LLDC on 13th August 2026, accompanied by Ma'am Jaya Hingorani and Ma'am Soonika Poojary. Students of Class X-A toured the centre on 14th August 2026, escorted by Ma'am Jaya Hingorani and Ma'am Vandana Naik.



During the visit, students explored the LLDC Crafts Museum, learning about various traditional crafts and regional techniques. They also participated in specially organised craft workshops, where each student had the opportunity to choose one craft from four distinct mediums—Tie and Dye, Block Printing, Pottery and Mud Work.



In the Tie and Dye and Block Printing sessions, students created unique patterns on handkerchiefs. The Pottery workshop enabled them to shape and finish a small clay pot on the wheel, while the Mud Work activity allowed them to create a decorative frame using traditional clay-relief techniques. These sessions were conducted under the expert guidance of skilled master artisans, making the experience both educational and deeply enjoyable.



The visit was an enriching and memorable learning experience. It not only helped students appreciate India's artistic and cultural heritage but also sparked creativity, curiosity and an understanding of traditional arts and design as viable future career avenues.
